Recordkeeping is a very valuable skill taught to members of the Texas 4-H program. Members are encouraged to keep project records and have these records reviewed annually by submitting a Texas 4-H Record book. In an effort to update the current record book system, it has been recommended and requested by many members, parents, and Extension staff that the Texas 4-H recordkeeping system (record books) be available as an online data entry system that easily allows for updates, editing, and printing.

Objectives:

- (1) Provide online system for 4-H members to document project activities, leadership, and community service, awards, and other 4-H project learning experiences.
- (2) Provide a secure data site to allow members to transition their 4-H recordkeeping to an online format that is easy to edit and update as activities and events occur.

Highlights:

- (1) Three levels for record book: Junior, Intermediate, and Senior
- (2) Forms may be completed through online entry system (www.4hreports.com) or may be downloaded from the Texas 4-H website.
- (3) Reference to 4-H objectives in the report form no longer required
- (4) Photo captions no longer required
- (5) Resume for seniors no longer required
- (6) Training material (both print and short video series) will be available to Counties for local training

CHRISTMAS TIME IS COMING

Christmas is right around the corner, and everyone will soon be busy with all the shopping, baking, and preparing all those favorite holiday dishes. Like many of you, I have always looked forward to this time of year. Christmas carols, movies, lights, decorated trees, and getting all the family together, and all the nice gifts. But there is one tradition treasured above all, recipe swapping with family and friends, so here are a few gathered and passed down through the years.



No Cook Divinity: Combine ½ cup boiling water, 1 tsp vanilla, 1/3 cup corn syrup Mix on high speed until stiff peaks about 5 min. transfer into large bowl and using low speed blend in 1-16oz box powdered sugar, stir in 1 cup chopped nuts. Drop by tsp full On wax paper when outside firm turn over, dry at least 12 hrs and store in airtight cont.

Red Hot Jello

1 small box of strawberry jello
Place 1 bag of red hots candy in 1 ½ cups
and water boil to dissolve candy
Then use 1 cup of red hot water in the jello
stir to dissolve jello
Instead of cold water add 1 cup of cold applesauce
Pour into molding dish and let set overnight
Wa'La a new tasty dessert

Peanut Butter Pie

Bake 1 graham cracker crust until

it turns just a little darker

Then set in refrigerator to cool

Mix together:

1 cup crunchy or smooth peanut butter

¹/₄ cup evaporated milk (Can Cream)

18 oz. cream cheese

1 cup powdered sugar

1 8oz. bowl cool whip

Pour into cooled crust and let set 4 hours

Eggnog Tube Cake

1 yellow cake mix

1 3.9 oz. package vanilla pudding mix

4 eggs

1cup eggnog

¹/₄ cup canola oil

1 ½ tsp ground nutmeg

2 tsp rum extract

Beat on med speed 3 min. then bake in well

greased Bundt or tube pan

Bake at 350 until toothpick test clean.

Glaze:

1 cup powdered sugar

½ tsp rum extract

3 or 4 tsp eggnog to get a drizzle consistency
